

SACRE paper on Promoting Fundamental British Values

Introduction
A new element to school inspections from September 2014 is a focus on Fundamental British Values and the importance of promoting these as part of work on preparing children and young people for 'life in modern Britain'. Reports from a small number of recent school inspections in Local Authorities (LAs) other than Newham suggest there may be some concerns in terms of how effectively the values are being promoted. Newham SACRE has been approached by RE teachers and senior leaders in our schools and asked for advice on promoting fundamental British values through RE and collective worship.
